Dr Kevin N. Cawley

Originally from Co. Armagh in Ireland, he completed his undergraduate degree at Trinity College Dublin in French and Irish. He has lived in Korea for several years, and obtained a Masters (with distinction) and PhD in Korean Studies from the School of East Asian Studies (SEAS) at the University of Sheffield, where his dissertation was supervised by the renowned Koreanist, Professor James Huntley Grayson, author of *Korea - A Religious History*. During his time in Sheffield he also worked as an interpreter for North Korean refugees.

He joined the UCC School of Asian Studies in September 2011 as the Director of the Irish Institute of Korean Studies at University College Cork. He is also the founding and managing editor of the Irish Journal of Asian Studies. He lectures in Korean Religious and Philosophical Traditions, as well as Korean Contemporary Society and Korean History.
